#### Pastor Rankin's Words for Action

I was able to see and hear about many things that are happening around our conference. The Central Texas Conference is working hard to find, train and build leaders in both the laity and clergy persons.

- One example is the Mission Leader Reading Group. This is an opportunity for anyone called to missions to read current best practices in missions and participate in guided discussion about how to use these ideas in the local church. There are 4 books and discussion group all over the conference. - Another example is the CTC Serve. This is a one day mission opportunity for churches in the conference to engage in their community in some way that connects to hunger. - There were many workshops that we learned more about including a Ministry Safe workshop, Hunger ministries and how to conduct community assessments for food, Justice for Our Neighbors and Project Transformation.

We are got to hear about just a few exciting things that the church is doing in the communities around them. Tenth Street UMC was recognized for their efforts in coordinating with UMCOR to provide housing and logistics during the Memorial Day flooding here in Taylor.

Bishop Lowry's Episcopal Address was a call to reach beyond our own faith story. The Paths of Discipleship clearly lays out a discipleship making system. We need to work on small group development, not just meeting as small groups, but having spiritual depth and growing our spiritual muscles. We need to start thinking about discipleship as a way of life for all of us. He also reminded us that the church can "break out" anywhere, not just a typical church building. In conclusion he called us to go out into the wilderness like in Exodus to reach the world.

- A new Hymnal is coming!
- Celebrated
  - o 20 years of Deacons
  - o 30 years of Disciple Studies
  - o 60 years of full clergy rights to women
  - O Upcoming 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the United Methodist Women
- Recalled and lamented the Sand Creek Massacre
- There were demonstrations and protests and they heard the Young People's Conference call the UMC to unity.
- There was a request and vote to follow the Council of Bishops' lead us in finding a way forward as a denomination. This is the first time a request like this has come to the Council and a called General Conference will happen in 2019 or 2020. This defers all votes on human sexuality and a special commission is being formed to work through this issue as a denomination.

As a conference we votes to learn and grow through this process while practicing grace with each other; and to follow the Book of Discipline.
