To help do our part to control the spread of Covid 19, FUMC MDO Taylor will take the following preventative measures:

Staff will wear masks when not social distanced from children and while in the classrooms with children.

Staff will follow CDC guidelines and recommendations for preschools to help reduce the spread of Covid 19. The current CDC guidelines can be found here:

Staff will wash hands and sanitize surfaces, toys, and other items touched by children frequently.

Students and staff will have their temperature taken before entering the building. Any student with a temperature greater than 100 degrees Fahrenheit will not be allowed to enter the school.

Any student or staff showing symptoms of Covid 19 including fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, vomiting or diarrhea may not return to school until they have been symptom free without the aid of medication for 72 hours or have a note from their physician stating that they may return to school.

If a student or staff has been in close contact with any individual that has tested positive for Covid 19, that student or staff must quarantine away from school for 14 days.

If a student or staff becomes infected with Covid 19, all of the children and staff in the entire preschool will quarantine away from school for 14 days.

As with any communicable illness, FUMC staff will notify parents in the case of an exposure.

Parents should notify FUMC staff in the event of any positive case in their household or possible exposure.

Together, we can stop the spread of Covid 19 in our community.
