LIGHTING OF ADVENT CANDLE

There is the voice of one crying in the wilderness.....the voice cries out for peace and justice, for hope and transformation.....that voice reaches to all of us who are comfortable. This morning those who are drawn to the manger and not the shepherds of old, but are children who are abused, hurt, lost, alone children who are cast aside - children who are driven into the slavery of poverty and who never hear the word of hope for something better.
